Purbeck Sculptor Jonathan Sells, known for his quirky figurative stone sculptures in the region, such as the Tregonwell/Creeke Sculpture outside the BIC and the sculpture in Christchurch Priory Gardens, recently had the pleasure of meeting HRH Princess Anne. It was at an unveiling of his work on Monday 29th June 2015, in Plymouth.

The work, a collaboration with Plymouth Artist, Richard Fisher, involved the design and creation of 4 stone panels for the new Genesis building in the Stonehouse area of Plymouth. Stonehouse Genesis was part of an overall community regeneration project. The building represents a new beginning for the area which has suffered massive unemployment and social deprivation. It now houses affordable offices and work units to encourage business development in the area.
